We came on site to begin the job on a Monday just before Christmas weekend. Farmer's needed the job performed right away before their lease ended at year end. Farmers put together a new call center with updated cubicles, furniture, and needed to vacate their current location prior to the end of the year.

With hundreds and probably even thousands of empty cubicles still in place, Farmers insurance called Global Power Supply to purchase and decommission the equipment.
